External Factors

- 1. Increased employment levels may have impacted overall college enrollment thereby reducing enrollment in our courses for the Fall Semester.
- 2. COVID-19/Stay-at-home order impacted student success in Spring courses.
- 3. Limited funding of conference and travel and professional development.
- 4. Exponential growth nationwide for online classes and degrees.
- 5. The emergence of COVID-19 has increased the need for heightened sanitizing of buildings as well as a need for sanitizing stations and a safety protocol for future health and wellness.

Internal Factors

- 1. Limited classroom availability especially during the T/TH 9:45 am-11:10 am time slot which is ideal for our Philosophy courses.
- 2. Limited or unreliable technology in 26 building classrooms.
- 3. Sociology classes too large to adequately support student success.
- 4. Minimal custodial services (even before COVID-19) has resulted in an ongoing lack of assurance of safety regulations and standards being met to ensure academic success.
