External Conditions, Trends, or Impacts: Modified regulations from the NCAA require additional support and oversight of student athletes to meet transfer requirements Internal Conditions, Trends, or Impacts: 1. Team sizes require additional assistant coaches to help with everything from monitoring safety during training sessions, driving and monitoring athletes at competitions, to helping to monitor academic success, and help with specializations that have not been accounted for in the past.

- 2. With over 700 active Student Athletes, our very small athletic training staff is at 233/1 ratio. This makes it very difficult to care for the student athletes needs for rehab and preventative care. To keep up current NATA and NCAA recommendations for athletic trainers, we would need a minimum of 2 additional F/T trainers while keeping our current permanent part time training staff.
- 3. With the addition of another FT academic counselor for student athletes our current academic counselor for student athletes ratio has been reduced to 350/1. We utilize 1-2 part time counselors to help off set this ratio, but we are in great need of 1 additional F/T academic counselors for student athletes. Student athletes are having more and more requirements to abide by for transfer purposes which are all extremely time sensitive, there is no way to keep up with those needs with our current staff size. Our student athletes have responded to numerous surveys saying they feel they are not being adequately heard and helped due to the lack of time available with the counselors. We are hoping the curren9 additional counselor will help with that.
- 4. Advancement personnel specifically assigned to fundraising on behalf of and in support of athletic initiatives. This would be instrumental in alumni engagement as well as community relationship building. There are a significant number of athletics alumni that have been very successful in their post collegiate athletic careers and in business that require a highly sophisticated engagement strategy. This is particularly timely with the stadium renovation and the need for engagement. The foundation currently supports our programs, but we feel we are active enough and have enough engagement opportunities to warrant someone specifically assigned to our area to work in conjunction with the foundation. This could help each program engage more in community outreach (promoting the team, dept and individual programs) instead of fundraising activities.
- 5. Hiring of new faculty/coaches has enhanced the instructional and coaching support for our student-athletes in areas of need.
