As a result, the quality of student work has increased and there is renewed interest in our program and demand for our advanced courses. As a result, there is a need for increased sections. For example, waitlists in Spring 2015 were: Phot 11, (13 students), Phot 18 (15 students) and Phot 20/21 (13 students). 2014-15	Core Indicators: Our Core Indicator report (2015-16) indicates positive numbers in all areas except #4 Employment. 2014-15	Completions: We have been meeting with students and advising them on their course selection and educational planning.
