1. Survey Results

- The survey results taken after the April 9th Forum were reviewed.
- Chief Florman is putting together a Q&A sheet of commonly asked questions.
- Shannon asked for feedback from the committee members, i.e., things they can do differently, or a different format.
- Committee members commented that the forum does not hear from the people who are pro police and proposed equipment.
- It was mentioned that students felt bullied by the outspoken students at the forums.
- It was suggested that faculty could give students an incentive to take the survey, such as extra credit.

2. DRAFT Body Worn Camera Policy

- The Body Worn Camera Draft Policy was reviewed.
- A committee member asked when the cameras would be on.

- i. The chief said the camera is recording all the time but records over itself until it is turned on and captures up to 30 seconds without audio before it is turned on. The officers will turn the cameras on when they respond to calls.
 - c. Students are concerned about their information being shared with other agencies.
 - d. Chief Florman reviewed PC 832.18 – Video Storage with the committee.
 - e. Question – How long is the data stored?
 - i. If it is not evidence, it is kept for 60 days; otherwise, as long as the litigation is ongoing. Logs or views of the video are saved forever. The data is owned by the department.
 - f. Question – What happens to the data if we change companies?
 - i. Generally, the data is transferred to the new company.
- 3. DRAFT Military Equipment Policy (Revised) / Rifles
 - a. The only revision in the draft of the policy is in the inventory.
 - b. The Fiscal Impact was updated. The committee was reminded that these are draft numbers that are subject to change.
 - c. A review of PC 300.4.2 Displaying of Firearms. The third bullet point (c.) may be removed.
- 4. Round Table
 - a. Chief Florman asked the committee if they were ready to make a recommendation to move forward with her proposals.
 - b. Comments:
 - i. The advisory committee just gives its recommendation, not approval, and does not make decisions.
 - ii. It would take local law enforcement too long to respond to and locate an incident on campus. The P&CS department knows the campus best.
 - iii. It is the feeling that the FA are concerned about policies.
 - iv. Most members are in favor of moving forward.
 - c. It was decided to bring the policies back to next month's meeting for continued review.
