James Reed shared his screen on "Pathways to Success: Black Males' Exploration of a Pathway Towards Completion. A Qualitive Study" presentation. He explained the purpose of the study is on Black males in California Community College and understanding their path that supports their academic goal. He asked the committee if they had questions or recommendations about the study. 	Recommendations to better assist Black Minority students: Shiloh explained how the R&P group has discussed implementing focus groups to reach out to Black students on supporting their needs. Create a five-point plan and focus on completing one point at a time. Continue to look at the Student Climate Survey. Gather additional data or focus groups, possibly partner with Male Minority Institute to assist with focus groups. Provide research, share the research experience, and pay students for their time. Find out how counselors or professors are assisting Black students. Have a plan in place, not just for counselors and professors, but also for the R&P group.
