













Services We Provide:

- One-on-one assistance with all college and financial aid applications
- One-on-one educational counseling
- Access to peer navigators/mentors
- Assistance with applying to other specialized programs
- Community referrals
- Workshops focusing on curricular and cocurricular development
- Tutoring referrals
- Expungement Clinics
- Connections to other system impacted student programs
- Cultural enrichment activities (ie, Hamilton, sporting event, LA Symphony)
- Access to program Social Worker
- Book vouchers each semester

Process for Referring Students:

- There are two methods to submit a referral to the program

- *Once the referral has been made a Rising Scholars staff member will contact the future student within a day to talk about the benefits of joining Rising Scholars, their goals, and given a timeline of what they need to complete to enroll at Mt. SAC

New this year

Added intentional services for youth on probation:

- Dual Enrolment Classes at East Camps
- Working with youth public defenders office
- alternative schools.



Our Growth:

We started October 2020 with less than 60 students.

As of this morning we have 350 student enrolled in credit courses for Fall 2024 with about 20 students in Non Credit maybe more.

We have graduated about 51 students since Spring 2021 with 3 up to 32 Spring 2024.

Projecting 50 this year with 77 eligible for a degree

Our Reach

Since November of 2020 we contacted with 2011 referrals.

We have had 1122 student complete our external application and assisted 993 register for our campus.








