PARALEGAL/ LEGAL ASSISTANT (AS)**

CAREER INFORMATION:

A.S. Degrees in Paralegal Studies ensure thorough preparation for a paralegal career by including courses in Legal Research, Writing, Civil Procedure, Law Office Procedures, Automated Law Office Procedures, Torts, Contracts, Property, Family Law, Bankruptcy and other areas.

Typically perform the following:

- Investigate and gather the facts of a case including interviews clients and witnesses
- Conduct research on relevant laws, regulations, and legal articles
- Organize and maintain documents in paper or electronic filing systems
- Gather and arrange evidence and other legal documents for attorney review and case preparation
- Write or summarize reports to help lawyers prepare for trials
- Help lawyers during trials by handling exhibits, taking notes or reviewing trial transcripts

LAWYER/ATTORNEY

CAREER INFORMATION:

Typically perform the following:

- Advise and represent clients in courts, before government agencies, and in private legal matters
- Communicate with their clients, colleagues, judges, and others involved in the case
- Conduct research and analysis of legal problems
- Interpret laws, rulings, and regulations for individuals and businesses
- Present facts in writing and verbally to their clients or others, and argue on behalf of their clients in a courtroom
- Prepare and file legal documents, such as lawsuits, appeals, wills, contracts, and deeds

***Educational Pathway:

"Paralegal" means a person who holds himself or herself out to be a paralegal, who is qualified by education, training, or work experience, who either contracts with or is employed by an attorney, law firm, corporation, governmental agency, or other entity, and who performs substantial legal work under the direction and supervision of an active member of the State Bar of California, as defined in Section 6060, or an attorney practicing law in the federal courts of this state, that has been specifically delegated by the attorney to him or her. Tasks performed by a paralegal include, but are not limited to, case planning, development, and management; legal research; interviewing clients; fact gathering and retrieving information; drafting and analyzing legal documents; collecting, compiling, and utilizing technical information to make an independent decision and recommendation to the supervising attorney; and representing clients before a state or federal administrative agency if that representation is permitted by statute, court rule, or administrative rule or regulation. (a) California Business & Professions Code §6450.

<u>Counseling Services</u>: Provides a range of services that include career, academic, and personal counseling, educational planning, and transfer preparation information. Check out recommended <u>suggested course sequence maps</u> for degrees, certificates, and transfer to Cal Poly Pomona.

Mt. SAC Library: Provides a range of resources to prepare students pursuing careers in education, and support students in all areas of study. The library has exam career exploration resources, film and article databases in law, and more!

Transfer Center: Helps students prepare to transfer through workshops, activities, events, and advising.
