- **Certificates:** Infant/Toddler Care Teacher through Child Development Program Administration
- **Degrees:** Child Development Early Intervention & Inclusion and Educational Paraprofessional

Elementary

EDUCATIONAL PATHWAY:

Requires a Bachelor's degree and multiple-subject credential.

- Major in Liberal Studies a breadth of study in a variety of subjects or a specific area of study such as **Early Childhood Development, Child and Adolescent Development**, English, Mathematics, Science, History, etc.
- Complete the transfer requirements or earn an AS-T or AA-T degree for a 4-year college such as CSU, UC, or private

Middle & High School

EDUCATIONAL PATHWAY:

Requires a bachelor's degree and single-subject credential.

- Major in a single subject such as Mathematics, Science, History, etc.
- Complete the transfer requirements or earn an Associate of Arts/Science-Transfer (**AS-T or AA-T**) degree for a 4-year college such as CSU, UC, or private.
