PREPARING TO TRANSFER

Take the right courses - Schedule a counseling appointment to develop a comprehensive transfer educational plan: www.mtsac.edu/counseling

- Most universities require general education (GE). A counselor can advise you about the CSU General Education (CSUGE), Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC), and additional GE options.
- Explore majors and begin taking major classes as soon as possible.



EXPLORE UNIVERSITIES AND FIND THE RIGHT FIT.

- Participate in university tours. Make an informed decision about the university you plan to attend.
- Schedule an appointment with university representatives to learn more about admission requirements.
- Visit the Transfer Center and meet with a Transfer Specialist. Research transfer information at our computer lab, get transfer advising, apply to universities, and check out ongoing activities.
- Attend transfer workshops. Learn about transfer requirements, admission applications, the next steps after you have applied, and how to make a smooth transition to the university after being admitted.

TIPS FOR TRANSFER SUCCESS

Get involved!

Join student clubs and organizations – in addition to student government, Mt. SAC has an array of clubs and organizations based on major, personal and career interests, community service, etc. Learn more: www.mtsac.edu/studentlife/

Join a student support program on campus such as ASPIRE, ACCESS, ACES, Bridge, ARISE, DREAM, EOP&S, REACH, etc. Learn more: www.mtsac.edu/studentservices/

Participate in programs for academic/personal enrichment such as UCLA CCCP, Mt. SAC Honors Program, research opportunities, summer programs about law school, medical school, academic success, and more.

WHEN YOU ARE APPLYING & ADMITTED TO UNIVERSITIES

- Check your email frequently and be aware of deadlines for transcripts and additional documents, accepting admission, orientation, etc.
- Review your financial aid award package to make an informed decision about your campus selection.
- Build a transfer success network meet with Mt. SAC transfer alumni and current applicants to learn about their transfer experience and how to best prepare.
- Participate in online/virtual transfer activities from the universities.

- Seek and apply to student support programs like those for low-income and first generation college students.
- Participate in transfer transition summer programs at the university such as Cal Poly Pomona EOP Transfer Bridge, UCLA Transfer Summer Program, and UC Santa Cruz Summer Academy.
- Secure housing in a timely manner.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CSU)

UPPER DIVISION TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

60 CSU transferable units

- At least 30 units of general education courses with grades of C- or better
- 2.0 transferable GPA
- Good standing at the last college attended

Four critical courses:

- Oral Communication
- Written Communication
- Critical Thinking
- Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning



APPLICATION DEADLINES

To apply: www.calstate.edu/apply

TO BE ACCEPTED FOR	YOUR APPLICATION MUST BE RECEIVED
Fall semester	October 1 - November 30 of the year before
Spring semester	August 1 - 31 of the year before

Some campuses and majors may accept applications after these deadlines, and deadlines may vary based on enrollment type or status (e.g. international, returning, and veteran applicants). Some campuses/majors do not accept applications for spring admission.

MAJOR PREPARATION (ASSIST)

Many CSU campuses and majors are impacted and may require a higher GPA and completion of specific courses for admission. Learn more about required and recommended major preparation courses:

Completion of CSUGE or IGETC

is recommended for most students but is not an admission requirement for most campuses/majors. Additionally, CSUGE and IGETC completion is not recommended for all majors.

CSU ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER (ADT)

With an ADT, you will be able to earn two degrees — your associate's degree and your bachelor's degree — with only 120 units if you transfer into a program at the CSU that's similar to the one in which you earned your associate's at a California Community College.

Additional Benefits

- Guaranteed admission to a CSU campus, though not necessarily to a particular campus or major
- GPA "bump" for admission consideration for impacted campuses/majors
- ADTs are also accepted by many private and out-of-state universities

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (UC)

UPPER DIVISION TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

60 UC transferable units

2.4 transferable GPA (2.8 for non-residents)

Completion of the following seven courses with a C or better:

- One transferable course in Mathematical Concepts & Quantitative Reasoning
- Two transferable courses in English Composition
- Four transferable college courses from at least two of the following subject areas:
 - Arts & Humanities
 - Social & Behavioral Sciences
 - Physical & Biological Sciences



APPLICATION DEADLINES

To apply: apply.universityofcalifornia.edu

TO BE ACCEPTED FOR	YOUR APPLICATION MUST BE RECEIVED
Fall semester or quarter	October 1 - November 30 of the year before
Winter quarter Spring semester (UC Merced)	July 1 - 31 of the year before

Many campuses do not accept applications for winter/spring admission. Some campuses and majors may accept applications after these deadlines.

MAJOR PREPARATION (ASSIST)

- Many UC campuses and majors are selective and may require a higher GPA and completion of specific courses for admission.
- Learn more about required and recommended major preparation courses: ASSIST.org
- Following a UC Transfer Pathways is a great way to plan your major coursework and keep your UC campus options open.

Completion of IGETC is

recommended for most students, but is not an admission requirement for most campuses/major. Additionally, IGETC completion is not recommended for all majors.

UC TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE (TAG)

You might be **eligible for a TAG** if you meet these basic requirements in addition to the campus specific criteria:

- 30+ UC transferable units at the time of your TAG application
- 2.7 3.6 or higher UC transferable GPA (required GPA varies by campus and is subject to change)

Six UC campuses offer the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program for California community college students who meet specific requirements.

UC Irvine UC Riverside UC Santa Cruz

HOW TO PURSUE TAG

- 1. Research and satisfy TAG requirements
- 2. Use the UC TAP to complete and submit the TAG application

Fall Term: September 1 - 30

Winter/Spring Term: May 1 - 31

3. Complete and submit the UC admission application

Fall Term: October 1 - November 30

Winter/Spring Term: July 1 - 31

UC TRANSFER ADMISSION PLANNER (UC TAP)

You can use the Transfer Admissions Planner to enter coursework (completed and planned) from the very beginning of your college career, or at any point when you decide to transfer to a UC campus.

With the UC TAP, you can:

- Track your progress toward meeting minimum UC requirements
- Apply for TAG
- Learn about transfer support and preparation programs

PRIVATE & OUT OF STATE TRANSFER OPTIONS

There are over 100 private and independent colleges and universities in California alone! With thousands of schools to choose from, you can also transfer out of state. Admission requirements will vary. Meet with a counselor early in your transfer process to explore the options and plan appropriate coursework.

- Many schools do not require a minimum number of units or specific courses for admission.
- Some colleges will accept CSUGE/IGETC.
- Some schools may require SAT/ACT scores and high school transcripts for admission consideration (but many schools waive this for students with 24-30+ units).
- Fees and deadlines to apply vary and many schools use the Common Application: www.commonapp.org

Please note that these are <u>estimated ranges</u> to help you understand cost of attendance and research options. Your personal expenses may vary greatly due to many factors such as living on/off campus or with family.

UNDERSTANDING "STICKER PRICE" VS. NET COST
