History and General Education

History courses fall into three separate General Education Areas—The Humanities (Area C), American Institutions (Area D1), and Social, Political, and Economic Institutions (Area D2). Several of our courses fit into more than one General Education Area. Each area has a clearly stated, expected outcome for the students (General Education Outcome or GEO). Listed below are the three areas, the History courses that fall under each area, and the GEO for each area.
