IF SOMEONE TELLS YOU THEY HAVE EXPERIENCED UNWELCOMED CONDUCT, HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Title IX prohibits gender discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual assault, rape, stalking, dating violence, and/or domestic violence.

WHAT TO DO:

- 1. If someone tells you they or someone they know has experienced unwelcomed conduct, offer support and encourage them to seek help as soon as possible.
- 2. Provide the person who experienced the unwelcomed conduct with this brochure.
- 3. Health and safety is the primary concern. If safety is at risk, call Police & Campus Safety at (909) 274-4555. If health is at risk call 9-1-1 or if you are a student, call Student Health Services at (909) 274-4000.
- 4. Contact Dr. Sokha Song, Title IX Coordinator at (909) 274-4225; Dr. Koji Uesugi, Dean, Student Services at (909) 274-4525; or Police & Campus Safety at (909) 274-4555.

WHAT YOU CAN SAY:

- There are many resources available on campus and in the community to help you take care of your physical and emotional well-being.
- I can connect you to medical emergency services for medical support, some of which are free of charge.
- I can connect you to a confidential resource.
 - Mental Health Counselor (Students)
 - o EASE (Employees)
 - o Project Sister (All)
- I can connect you with the Title IX Coordinator who can talk to you about resources, reporting options, and interim measures of campus support.
- You have the right to understand all available options and make an informed decision.
- I cannot keep this information confidential. I need to forward this information to someone who can help you and respond. That person will give you information and options to help you going forward.

TITLE IX PROHIBITS:

Gender discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual assault, rape, stalking, dating violence, and/or domestic violence.

WHAT TO DO:

If you have experienced unwelcomed conduct, you are strongly encouraged to:

□ SEEK SUPPORT *

 Medical Services & Confidential Resources

□ REPORT *

 You are encouraged to report unwelcomed conduct to Sokha Song, Title IX Coordinator, or other campus resources to assist you.

□ PRESERVE EVIDENCE

 You do not have to choose a course of action immediately, but it is important to preserve evidence in case you choose to make a complaint or pursue charges.
 Possible evidence might be clothing, bedding, letters, photos, emails, text messages, etc.

WHAT TO KNOW:

- You may report an incident within one year of the date of the incident; however, Mt.
 SAC encourages reporting incidents as soon as possible.
- There are many resources to help you on campus and in the community. *
- You may choose to speak with a confidential resource without reporting to the College or law enforcement. *
- If you decide to report, your information will only be shared with those who need to know.
- If needed, services, accommodations and other assistance can be implemented to ensure a safe and supportive environment for you.
- Mt. SAC acts promptly and appropriately to prevent and stop any acts of retaliation toward anyone who reports unwelcomed conduct.
