FRAUDULENT ENROLLMENT: UPDATE

As part of our ongoing efforts to address fraudulent enrollment, Instruction, Student Services, and IT teams worked collaboratively to address fraudulent student enrollment. Potentially fraudulent students were sent messages to their personal and school e-mails asking them to call and provide additional information by Friday, February 7th. All students with a California address were called. Combined, these efforts were aimed at providing students with advance notification of the potential administrative drop. On Friday, those who had not verified additional information were included an administrative drop process—these students were dropped from registered course rosters and waitlists. Additionally, a registration hold was placed on their accounts and their email access was placed on hold.

We will continue to work together to address fraudulent enrollment while ensuring support for any students who may have been inadvertently affected by this administrative drop process. If a genuine, non-fraudulent student was inadvertently dropped, the student can contact the designated Counseling support number at **909.274.4100** to verify additional information. The Counseling team will support students in lifting their registration hold and supporting them in enrolling in courses.

Given the high volume of reviews being processed, we kindly ask faculty to limit nonurgent communications with the RSI team this week. Winter 2025 Final Grades

With the end of the Winter 2025 intercession rapidly approaching, all **Winter grades are due by 8 p.m. on Tuesday, February 18**. The Admissions and Records Office will initiate the "grade roll" or "batch" process of all Fall grades **in Banner immediately following the 8 p.m. deadline on Tuesday**.

We thank you for submitting your grades on or before Tuesday, February 18. Here are some reasons why students need their grades posted on time:

- Students need to know if they passed a pre-requisite course so they can register for the next course in a sequence.
- Students need to complete units aligned with the federal or state financial aid they have received.
- Our Veteran students may need proof of completion to receive veterans' benefits.
- Students send their transcripts to their transfer university, confirming they are ready to transfer in the upcoming semester.
- Students' wage increases, bonuses, or promotional opportunities depend on passing employerapproved courses or programs.
- Students must show satisfactory progress on their academic and/or progress probation status.
