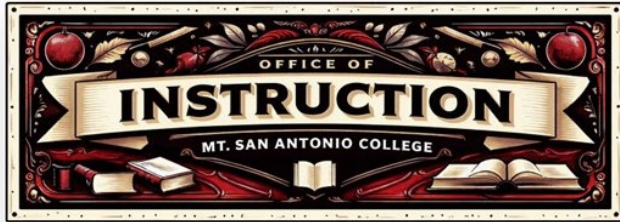

ACCREDITATION UPDATE: SHIFTING FEDERAL LANDSCAPE

The federal landscape for higher education and accreditation continues to shift. I am sharing a recent [communication from ACCJC President Dr. Mac Powell](#) highlighting several important developments.

Three key areas highlighted in the communication are:

- **Student Outcomes:** The proposed regulations would require accreditors to evaluate program-level outcomes, including completion, licensure pass rates, and earnings data.
- **Academic Freedom and Intellectual Diversity:** The proposed regulations would require accreditors to evaluate institutional policies related to academic freedom, intellectual diversity, First Amendment protections at public institutions, and the free exchange of ideas.
- **Student and Faculty Perspectives:** The proposed regulations would require institutions to measure student and faculty perceptions of the range of viewpoints and perspectives offered by the institution or program.

While these regulations are currently proposed and are not yet in effect, the Accreditation Steering Committee (ASC) reviewed and discussed these recent federal developments last week. ASC and the Accreditation Core Team will continue to monitor the federal landscape and provide updates to the College community as additional information becomes available.

Mt. SAC 2026 – 2027 BUDGET AND PLANNING UPDATE (VICE PRESIDENT JOE DOMINGUEZ)

As Vice President Joe Dominguez shared in his recent [budget and planning update](#) last week, Mt. SAC continues to experience strong enrollment. Although Mt. SAC received state funding for a portion of our recent enrollment growth, approximately \$10.8 million associated with additional FTES generated in 2025–2026 was not

funded by the State. This is an important consideration as we plan our course schedules and make decisions about adding sections.

As part of our strategic enrollment management approach, we will continue adding sections where the data demonstrate student demand, student need, and where additional offerings support students' progress toward completion. At the same time, we are taking a more measured approach than in recent years, looking closely at waitlists, enrollment trends, fill rates, course sequencing, program and pathway needs, and students' progress toward completion. While we may not add sections at the same pace we have in the past, we are continuing to respond when the data and student needs support additional classes. Practical considerations, including available facilities and staffing, may also affect our ability to add sections.

We recognize that this shift may require adjustments in how we plan and schedule courses, and we appreciate your flexibility and patience as we respond to state funding, unfunded enrollment growth, changing enrollment conditions, legislative changes, and other external factors. We will continue to work closely with department chairs and deans as we navigate these changing conditions and plan future schedules. Our focus remains on providing students access to the courses they need, supporting their progress toward completion, and balancing those needs with Mt. SAC's long-term fiscal stability.

DEADLINE TO WITHDRAW

The deadline to withdraw from a course with a “W” is now set at the **75% point of each class**, in accordance with [AP 5075: Course Adds and Drops](#), which was recently updated to align with Title 5 ([§ 55024](#)) regulations on withdrawals. If you viewed or printed your schedule prior to Wednesday, August 19, it may still display the withdrawal deadline at the 60% point. Please review your schedules carefully to ensure that the section dates reflect the updated deadline.

Early Alert on Navigate 360 for Student Success Training Opportunities

REMINDER: DROPPING NO SHOW STUDENTS

As a reminder, Mt. SAC also has two Administrative Procedures (APs) that also address dropping No Show students:

- [AP 5075 Course Adds and Drops](#) states that “an instructor may drop a student who has not arrived within the first 30 minutes of the first course meeting of an in-person or synchronous online course. For asynchronous online courses, students must complete the No Show activity designated by their professor within three days to demonstrate attendance or they will be dropped from the course for nonattendance.”
- Additional information in [AP 4105 Distance Learning](#) states (bottom of page 3), “faculty will drop, as a No-Show, any student who has not actively participated in the course or has not completed the faculty-determined check-in activity. Faculty members have discretion to establish any date between the official start of the term and the third day of the term.”

Per [Title 5 Section §58004](#), professors have the responsibility to clear their rosters of inactive students who are considered “No Show” students in online, hybrid, and face-to-face courses. For in-person courses, attendance is determined by physical presence, while in online courses, participation is measured through participation as defined in policy and on the professor’s syllabus. These policies apply regardless of course waitlists. To provide clarity for students, professors are encouraged to include a statement in their syllabus outlining their course-specific drop policy, including how and when No Show students will be dropped.
