### What are Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)?

SLOs are measurable statements about what students will think, know, or be able to do as a result of an educational experience.

SLOs help us learn if we are providing students with the educational experience we intend to provide.



### What is a Student Learning Outcome?

Students will <action verb> <concept, skill, ability, attitude>.

COURSE: THTR 12 students will be able to evaluate the acting performances of others.

DEGREE: Upon successful completion of the Theater program, the student will be able to analyze and critique elements of the production in their historical and cultural context.

Advocate for achievement of SLOs!


