

#### Women

Choose 2 American women who have been significant in women's history, each from a different time period, and compare them using the questions below.

- Explain your project. Who will you be comparing? How do you plan to compare them: What elements or aspects of the two decades do you plan to look at?
- 2. Why did you pick this particular topic and these particular women?
- 3. Compare and contrast: what do they have in common? How are they different? What can you tell about them by analyzing your primary sources?
- 4. Analysis: What do the commonalities and differences tell us about the time periods during which these women lived? Questions to consider: What was happening with women in general during your chosen time periods? How were these women significant? And how was their significance restrained or enhanced by the prevailing view of women at the time? Were there external influences at play (immigration/labor/suffrage campaigns/wars/availability of materials/etc)?



**3.** English Faculty, Selena Zeledon created a Banned Books Week assignment. Students found a banned book and wrote a critical thinking assignment.



#### Overview

As discussed in Chapter 1 – Introduction of Sports Nutrition in <u>Nutrition for Sport & Exercise 3ed.</u>, the topic of sports nutrition discusses the importance of understanding and evaluating scientific evidence. Peer review is one important safeguard in the publication of scientific research which means that a scientific study that is peer reviewed offers more credibility than a study which is not reviewed by experts in that same field. This is the reason that we seek out "peer reviewed" studies.

### Purpose of the assignment

The purpose of this assignment is to examine <u>TWO</u> original research articles in a <u>peer-reviewed</u> exercise whysiology or sport nutrition journal and write a concise summary of the important aspects of the study.

This assignment will also introduce you to two services offered on this campus; Library Services and Tutoring Services.
