

Concept Check: A たら B

The sentence structure $A \, t \, b \, B$ is used to describe a situation where B is contingent on the conditions of A being met. In English we would phrase this as "If A, then B." In this activity, you will use $A \, t \, b \, B$ to plan what you will do on a trip to Japan.

Here are some examples of sentences using the A たら B structure:

Ex. お金が<u>あったら</u>、私はおみやげをかいます。If I have money, then I will buy souvenirs.

Ex. 東京に<u>行ったら、</u>スカイツリーに行きます。If I go to Tokyo, then I will visit the Skytree.

Note that the condition before $\hbar \hat{b}$ should be conjugated into short form past tense.
