### **Section 3: Plural or Singular**

We often use "there is" and "there are" in descriptions. Maybe when we describe a scene. Or to describe something that we see.

We use "there is" when we are talking about a singular subject (book) and we use "there are" when we are talking about a plural subject (books). In these sentences, the subject is AFTER the verb. For example: There is a book on the table. / There are books on the table.













