

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Section 2: Using Expedia

People will often use travel websites to plan their vacations because it is easy to use and can offer you a good deal. You will use Expedia to plan your flight and hotel accommodations. Go to <u>Expedia.com</u> to get started.



Step 1: Make sure the "Stay added" and "Flight added" icons are blue. "Stay added" will include hotels in your results.

Step 2: Fill in all of the boxes such as your airport information, number of travelers, departure date, and

returning date.

Step 3: Click the blue search button.

Step 4: Select a flight and hotel option within your budget. Remember you only have \$3,000.00 for your entire trip (including restaurants and attractions, which you will research in the next section). For your notes, you can write down your flight and hotel information below in addition to the price.

Now that you have chosen your flight and hotel, it is time to plan your trip! After you complete the itinerary on the following page with your flight and hotel information, go to TripAdvisor.com to plan the rest of your trip (attractions and restaurants).
