
Section 1: Introduction

American football is watched and played by many in the US. Watch the <u>Section 1 Video</u> for an introduction to the sport.



Are your ready for some football? Every time you watch a football game, you will hear an announcer say this at the beginning. Football or American football is one of the most popular sports in the United States. It is a team sport that is played on a large field that has two goalposts at opposite ends of the field. Football teams have 11 players on the field.

The players wear helmets, shoulder pads, football shoes, and team jerseys. Fans buy tickets to watch their favorite teams play. The object is to gain the ball and score a touchdown or a field goal. So, are you ready to learn about American football?





Section 2: Vocabulary

Vocabulary Word 1. Goalposts: "The kicker will try to kick the football through the goalposts." 2. To tackle: "You need to tackle any player that has the ball on the team you are playing." 3. Quarterback: "The quarterback decides where the ball is going on each play." 4. Touchdown: "With one more touchdown, we can win this game." 5. Running back: "A running back needs to be strong and fast. 6. End zone: "If you can get the ball in the end zone you have a touchdown." 7. Offense: "When the team is on offense, they have the ball." 8. Defense: "When the team is on defense, they don't' have the ball." 9. Down: "We have to take advantage of every down we get."

- B. To score six points in the game of football by getting into the opposing team's end zone.
- C. On a football field, there are two. They are at opposite ends of the field. Teams try to put the football through them.


