



To pursue a career as a registered nurse in the U.S., I decided to achieve my educational goal first. My educational goal is to earn an Associate's Degree and then transfer for a Bachelor's Degree. I know that all my goals will remain dreams if I do not take action. Therefore, I take classes to improve my English skills to make all my goals a reality.

I believe education and hard work are the keys to success. As a result, I study hard. Despite the time-consuming Student Union activities and volunteer work I did in my country, I received scholarships for two consecutive academic years at college.
