


2. Change "destination"/printer to "Save as PDF."

<u>Corrine</u>: Oh, thanks, but my parties wouldn't be fun without you – you're always **the life of the party!** 


<u>Antoinette</u>: I do like parties! Some might even say I'm a **party animal!** . . . By the way, do you need help with anything?
