The director of *Bao*, Domee Shi, was the first woman to ever direct a short film for Pixar, the prominent animation studio that created films like *The Incredibles, Up*, and *Toy Story*. Domee was inspired to create *Bao* by her own experience growing up in Canada as the only child of Chinese parents. Domee and her parents immigrated to Canada when she was just two years old.

You will watch *Bao* in Section 4. This film helps capture an experience that is familiar to many immigrant families, Chinese or not. *Bao* won the Oscar for Best Animated Short Film in 2019.
