

ENROLLMENT BY TYPE OF STUDENT





Brief History



Circa 1952. Mt. San Antonio in the background, also known as Mt. Baldy.

As World War II came to an end, local leaders anticipated the return of young students who needed to complete their college education.

A meager budget of \$191,790 was pulled together and furniture was obtained either from surplus war materials or made from apple crates and orange boxes from the surrounding groves. Through dedication and perseverance, the campus community did the impossible. In just two months, they opened classes on September 16, 1946 with 454 men and 181 women registered.

The College community's ability to come together and surmount challenges is still evident today and is affectionately known as the Spirit of Mt. San Antonio College.


The college was initially named Eastern Los Angeles County Community College, and was later renamed after Mt. San Antonio, the snow-capped mountain prominently visible in the distance above campus.

Today, Mt. San Antonio Colleg has emerged as an educational leader in the state of California. It is one of the largest and bestknown of community colleges in the country.
