Jamie Rocha

Tribal Council Member & Secretary of Press and PR, Gabrielino-Shoshone Nation of Southern California

Jamie Rocha is a member of the Gabrielino-Shoshone Nation, one of the indigenous groups whose ancestral home is the Los Angeles Basin in Southern California. Rocha currently serves on the Gabrielino-Shoshone Tribal Council continuing the legacy of her grandmother, the late Chief Ya'anna Vera Rocha. She currently works for Anawakalmekak, Los Angeles County's only indigenous K-12 school, as a tribal liaison and coordinator for several of their grant-funded programs such as Native Ways 2 College (a college preparatory program for Los Angeles County Native American students), the Anawakalmekak American Indian Teacher Fellowship, and the Intergenerational Gabrielino Language Ecosystem ANA grant program. She is also a graphic designer for the Gabrielino-Shoshone Nation and Tzicatl CDC, as the webmaster for their respective websites. She serves as an advocate for indigenous education and curriculum reform, as well as an activist for many indigenous causes. In her downtime, she also works in the live music industry as a tour and merchandise manager for several independent music bands.

Gabrielle (Rocha) Crowe

Co-Chairperson & Secretary of Environmental Sciences, Gabrielino-Shoshone Nation of Southern California

Gabrielle (Rocha) Crowe is the Vice Chair and the Secretary of Environmental Sciences for the Gabrielino-Shoshone Nation and a collaborator with Anawakalmekak, the only indigenous K-12 charter school in Los Angeles where she works as the Intergenerational Gabrielino Language Ecosystem ANA Grant Program manager since 2022. She is also a Cultural and Environmental Education Consultant for the Ballona Wetlands Land Trust. She helps create science curriculum for their IndigeNations Summer Program, an Indigenous Land Rematriation Fellow, a member of the Tribal Marine Collaborative, a member of several MPA (Marine Protected Areas) Collaboratives in Southern California, she is also a representative in several tribal advisory groups overseeing projects at the Ballona Wetlands Ecological Reserve, The Los Cerritos Wetlands, and a partnership with the Catalina Island Conservancy. Her role in the tribal council is bridging the gap between environmental and cultural education for dillerent non-profit organizations as well as facilitating communication between her nation and various agencies.
