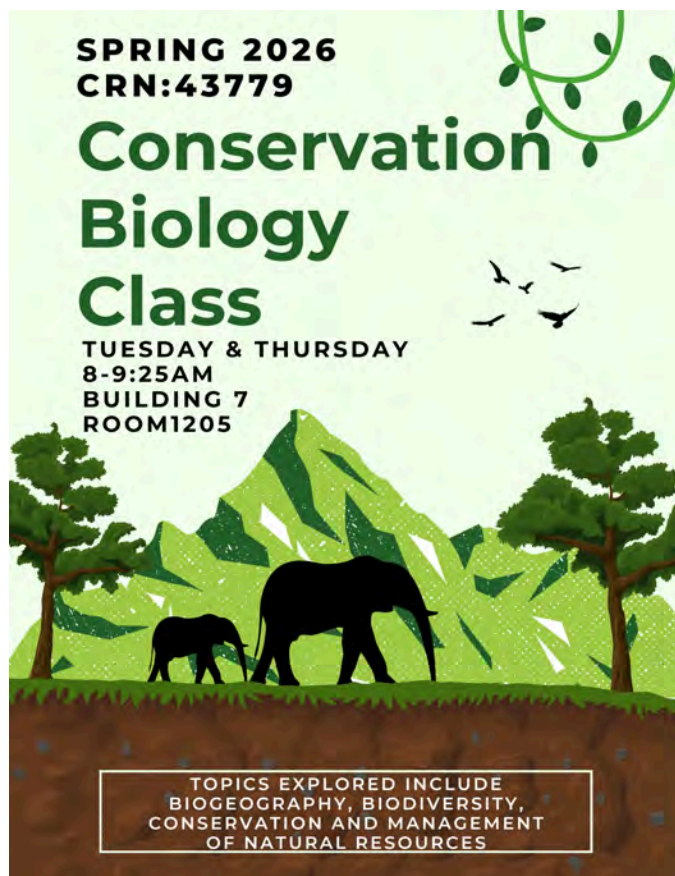
Unity Fair Volunteers Needed
