What is the California Youth Leadership Corps (CYLC)?

California Youth Leadership Corps (CYLC) is a unique statewide initiative of the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency, CLP, selected community colleges, social justice organizations and private philanthropy, was created as a response to the global pandemic and the economic crisis. CYLC prepares historically marginalized youth to become community organizers and change agents in their local communities. CYLC is collaborating with its state and local partners to scale up community change learn-and-earn career pathways across California.

California Youth Leadership Corps (CYLC) – Mt. SAC

CYLC-Mount San Antonio College offers a learn-and-earn community change career pathway program that enriches and prepares historically marginalized students for community change careers in the nonprofit and public sectors. While students pursue their postsecondary credential (either a certificate or an AA), they participate in paid work-based learning opportunities with nonprofit organizations partner organizations in their local communities. These nonprofit organizations help to prepare CYLC student participants with the community organizing, advocacy, and leadership skills to enter a community change career in environmental justice fields.

Students who participate have the opportunity to be awarded up to \$10,000 in stipend awards and a scholarship of \$5,000 while they are enrolled in the CYLC-Mt. Sac program.

Eligibility: CYLC serves community college students who are primarily between the ages of 18-24; however, students who are over the age of 24 are eligible to apply.

Core Components to the Program:

Work-Based Learning

Gain invaluable experience by doing meaningful community change work with local partners focused on a variety of issues.

Academic Growth

Receive a credential designed to build the leadership and organizing capacity of people who have been directly impacted by injustice.

Leadership Development

Become a leader in your community by applying your lived-experience, receiving mentorship, and gaining essential skills.

Meet like-minded students in the CYLC cohort focused on empowering themselves and their communities for the better.
