

Dear Student,

We hope this message finds you well. We'd like to inform you that after the **Spring 2026** semester, you have been placed on one or both of the following based on your academic performance:

Academic Probation: You attempted at least 12 units, and your Mt. SAC cumulative grade point average (GPA) is below 2.00; and/or

Progress Probation: You enrolled in a total of at least 12 units, and earned 50% or more units of **W, I,** and/or **NP**. Excused Withdrawals (**EW**) do not count toward probation.

What does it mean to be on Probation? How will this affect you? How can we help?

- Your registration dates for **Winter/Spring 2027** will be delayed until you complete the **online Probation Success Workshop***.
 - This workshop will help you understand how to return to Good Standing and avoid the potential for losing your fee waiver (CA College Promise Grant).
 - Access the workshop directly from the **Probation Card** located on the **Student** page of your portal account.
 - Complete the workshop before Winter 2027 registration begins in September and your registration dates will not be negatively affected.
- While on probation, you are limited to enrolling in *4 units* for the Winter 2027 session and *12 units* for the Spring 2027 semester.
 - If you are an International Student, you may NOT take fewer than 12 units per semester.
 - If you are part of a priority group such as Athletics, EOPS, and Veterans, you will no longer receive priority registration until you return to Good Standing and meet all other priority registration requirements. Your registration date will be determined by the number of Mt. SAC cumulative units earned.
