

Dear Student,

We hope this message finds you well. We'd like to inform you that due to your Spring 2024 academic performance, you are no longer in Good Standing. You have fallen into one or both types of the following probation warnings:

Academic Probation Warning: You have attempted at least 12 units, and your cumulative grade point average (GPA) is below 2.00; and/or

Progress Probation Warning: You were enrolled in a total of at least 12 units, and you earned 50% or more units of **W, I,** and/or **NP/NPV**. Excused Withdrawals (**EW**) do not affect your probation standing.

What does it mean to be on Probation? How will this affect you?

- Your registration date for the **Winter** and **Spring 2025** terms will be moved to the LAST day of the registration period unless you complete the **online Probation Success Workshop***.
 - This workshop will help you understand this warning, how to return to Good Standing, and the potential for losing your fee waiver (CA College Promise Grant).
 - Access the workshop directly from the **Probation Channel located in the student tab of your portal account**. Complete the workshop by *September 6th* and your Winter and Spring 2025 registration dates will not be negatively affected.
- While on probation, you are limited to enrolling in *no more than 4 units for the Winter 2025 session and no more than 12 units for the Spring 2025 semester*.
 - If you are an International Student, you may NOT take fewer than 12 units per semester.
 - If you are part of a priority group such as Athletics, EOPS and Veterans, you will no longer receive priority registration until you return to Good Standing and meet all other priority registration requirements. Your registration date will be determined by the number of Mt. SAC cumulative units earned.
- Schedule a counseling appointment during the Fall 2024 semester to review your academic progress. Visit the [Counseling](#) page or call the Counseling Department at (909) 274-4380 to schedule your appointment.

NOTE: All communication regarding your academic standing will come from the Counseling Department's Probation Channel located in the student tab of your portal account. If you still have questions about your standing, email their Probation Success Team at probation@mtsac.edu.
