Karen Wall and Bill Eastham have provided the attached information in response to Dr. Hall's questions during Wednesday night's Board of Trustees meeting regarding our agreement with the City of Walnut.

#### Information Summary:

- In 1996-97 Mt. SAC received \$654,000 from the City of Walnut to be used toward construction costs of our Performing Arts Center.
- The agreement between Walnut and Mt. SAC states that Mt. SAC will reimburse Walnut \$1 for every ticket sold for all Performing Arts Center performances.
- The agreement also states that the City is entitled to ten "free" days per year each
  for the Clarke Theater and the Recital Hall. The fair rental value of the "free" days is
  credited by the City as contributing toward the reimbursement.
- Through June 30, 1999, the City has been reimbursed \$37,784 for ticket sales and \$38,508 for usage credit for a total of \$76,292.

The accounting summary for the first quarter should be completed soon. It appears that we will reach the \$100,000 reimbursement threshold this year. When that occurs, we may want to use that occasion as a photo opportunity for distribution to the local media.

#### **AGREEMENT**

#### **BETWEEN**

#### WALNUT IMPROVEMENT AGENCY

#### AND

#### MT. SAN ANTONIO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

WHEREAS Mt. San Antonio Community College District (hereafter "the District") has received approval from the State of California for the construction of a new, state-of-the-art, 66,700 square foot Performing Arts Center which will include a 400 seat theatre; a 250 seat recital hall; a dance studio which can accommodate up to 150 convertible seats; a rehearsal lab with an audience capacity of 150 convertible seats; drama, band and choral rooms; scene shop; classrooms; music rooms; offices; and lecture rooms; and

WHEREAS the total projected cost of the Performing Arts Center is \$16,957,000; and

WHEREAS the total state approved and anticipated support for the Performing Arts Center is \$15,291,000, leaving a budget shortfall for the project of \$1,666,000; and

WHEREAS the District has always enjoyed a very positive relationship with the residents of the City of Walnut (hereafter "the City"), with community members being very supportive of the performing arts and cultural programs at the college; and

WHEREAS the presence of the Performing Arts Center in the community will benefit the residents of the City of Walnut by providing high quality theatrical, dance and musical performances in the community; and

WHEREAS the Walnut Improvement Agency (hereafter "the Agency") wishes to participate on behalf of the Walnut community in the construction of the Performing Arts Center.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the following promises, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Financial Assistance by the Agency</u>. The Agency shall contribute a maximum of \$1,000,000 to the District for construction of the Performing Arts Center.
- a. The parties agree that \$1,000,000 constitutes 5.9 percent (5.9%) of the total estimated cost of construction of the Performing Arts Center.

- b. If the final cost of the Performing Arts Center is reduced, the contribution from the Agency will be reduced to a rate of 5.9 percent (5.9%) of the total construction cost.
- c. The Agency's contribution shall be used only for the purpose of construction of the Performing Arts Center. Upon reasonable request by the Agency, the District shall provide an accounting of the expenditure of the Agency's \$1,000,000 contribution.
- 2. <u>Time of Payment</u>. The Agency's obligation to deliver its contribution shall arise when the District has obtained funding to complete the Performing Arts Center. Therefore, the Agency shall promptly make payment upon both of the following:
- a. Certification by the District to the Agency in writing that it has received commitment for payment of the remaining \$666,000 in budget shortfall;
- b. Certification by the District to the Agency in writing that ninety percent (90%) of State funding has been drawn.
- 3. <u>Reimbursement</u>. The District will reimburse the City for the Agency's share of the cost of construction of the Performing Arts Center by making payment for a period of twenty (20) years effective upon the date the Performing Arts Center is open and operational. Reimbursement from the District to the City shall be as follows:
- a. The District will pay to the City on a quarterly basis \$1.00 for every ticket sold for all performances held within the Performing Arts Center. The \$1.00 per ticket revenue shall not be a tax.
- b. Payments due the City under this provision shall be computed quarterly, for the preceding quarter, as of March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31. Each quarterly payment shall be due and payable no later than sixty (60) calendar days after the dates listed in the previous sentence. Each payment shall be accompanied by a brief report showing the basis for the computation and such other relevant facts as may be reasonably required by the City.
- c. The City shall have the right to inspect the District's records showing the gross receipts from which its payments are computed and the right of audit and recomputation of any and all amounts paid under this Section. No acceptance of any payments shall be construed as a release or as an accord and satisfaction of any claim the City may have for further or additional sums payable under this Section for the performance of any other obligation hereunder.
- d. In the event that the payment from the District to City is not received by the City within the specified time of sixty (60) calendar days, District shall be subject to a penalty in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the amount then due the City, based on ticket sales, or of \$500, whichever is less; the penalty will be assessed and paid for each month or portion thereof, not including the sixty (60) calendar day grace period, in which the payment remains due and owing.

- e. The City of Walnut, together with other civic organizations designated in writing by the City to the District, shall have all fees waived for use of the Theatre for a total of ten days per year, and shall have all fees waived for use of the Recital Hall for a total of ten days per year. All other uses of the facilities shall be at their fair rental value.
- f. The schedule of free use by the City and civic organizations shall be by mutual agreement between City and District.
- g. The fair rental value of the ten days of use of the Theatre and the ten days of use of the Recital Hall shall be reported in the District's quarterly report to the City and shall be credited by the City as a reimbursement from the District.
- h. Revenue to the City from ticket sales under this agreement is estimated to total \$1,000,000 over the twenty-year reimbursement period. If, at the conclusion of twenty (20) years, reimbursement under Sections 3a and 3g does not total a minimum of \$1,000,000, then this Agreement shall automatically renew and remain in effect until reimbursement revenue to the City under Sections 3a and 3g totals \$1,000,000.
- i. At any time during the terms of this agreement the District may repay the unpaid balance of the \$1,000,000 to the Agency, and at such time, all terms and conditions of this agreement will cease. "Unpaid balance" shall mean \$1,000,000 less any reimbursement which has been made and credited pursuant to sections 3a and 3g of this agreement.
- 4. <u>Acknowledgement</u>. The District shall acknowledge the contribution and assistance of the Agency in the following ways:
- a. Upon completion of the dedication of the Performing Arts Center, a special reception for residents of the City of Walnut will be held by the District.
- b. Residents of the City of Walnut will be given first opportunity to purchase season tickets for the twenty-year term of reimbursement.
- c. A special tribute to the City of Walnut will be prominently displayed in the lobby of the Performing Arts Center in recognition of the City's financial assistance during the twenty year reimbursement period.
- d. A tribute to the City of Walnut will appear in each program for the twenty-year term of reimbursement.
- 5. Exemption from Benefit Assessment District. If the District establishes a benefit assessment district for recreation and/or performing arts facility construction or maintenance, the property owners in the City of Walnut will be exempt for the twenty-year term of reimbursement, or the City will be reimbursed in an amount equal to \$1,000,000 less any reimbursement which had been made and credited pursuant to Sections 3a and 3g of this agreement.

- 6. <u>Damage or Destruction of Performing Arts Center</u>. In the event that all or a part of the Performing Arts Center is damaged or destroyed, partially or totally, from any cause during the period of this Agreement, then the District may, at its sole option, do one of the following:
- a. The District shall, at no cost to the Agency, from the proceeds of insurance or, to the extent permitted by law, from any other lawfully available funds of the District, cause the Performing Arts Center to be repaired, restored and rebuilt.
- b. The District shall promptly, from the proceeds of insurance or from any other lawfully available funds of the District, pay to the Agency an amount equal to \$1,000,000 less any reimbursements which have been made and credited pursuant to Sections 3a and 3g of this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Understanding of the Parties</u>. This Agreement shall constitute the complete and exclusive statement of understanding between the District and the Agency, unless amended in writing. Further, this Agreement supersedes all previous written or oral representations or agreements made between the District and the Agency relating to the subject of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Notice</u>. All notices required under this Agreement shall be deemed given when personally delivered or deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, to the following:

9. <u>Assignment</u>. The Agency shall not assign or transfer by operation of law, or otherwise, any or all of its rights or obligations under this Agreement.

#### 10. Hold Harmless.

a. District shall, to the extent permitted by law, indemnify, protect, defend and hold the Agency and the City of Walnut, its officers, agents, employees and independent contractors free and harmless from any costs, attorney's fees, expenses, losses, liability, claims, damages, and causes of action whatsoever, based or asserted on an act or omission, including premises liability, of the District, its officers, agents,

employees, subcontractors and independent contractors, for property damage, bodily injury, death or any other element of damage of any kind or nature relating to or in any way connected with or arising from this agreement.

b. To the extent that the Agency or the City of Walnut uses the Performing Arts Center or designates other civic organizations to use the Performing Arts Center pursuant to Paragraph 3e of this agreement, Agency and the City of Walnut shall, to the extent permitted by law, indemnify, protect and hold District, its officers, agents, employees and independent contractors free and harmless from any costs, attorney's fees, expenses, losses, liability, claims, damages and causes of action whatsoever, based or asserted on an act or omission of Agency or the City of Walnut, its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors and independent contractors, for property damage, bodily injury or death or any other element of damage of any kind or nature related to or in any way connected with or arising from the Agency's or City of Walnut's use of the Performing Arts Center or designates other civic organizations to use the Performing Arts Center pursuant to paragraph 3e of this agreement.

Under the terms of the Agreement Between the Walnut Improvement Agency and the Mt. San Antonio Community College District, the College is to submit quarterly payment for ticket fees collected pursuant to the agreement. Our office has now completed the task of reviewing receipts for the past quarter, and I am pleased to submit under this cover a check for ticket fees in the amount of \$2,019.00. Additionally, we are submitting a claim for an additional credit of \$2192.00 for the City's use of the Center on December 2<sup>nd</sup> and December 3<sup>rd</sup> as per our agreement.

I have also included a brief summary of the sales figures for each event as required by the agreement. A considerable amount of additional information is available to you at all times to substantiate these figures if required.

The sales report does include on correction to an event at the Center on September 13, 1996. Two seats to the production of Oleana were mistakenly entered into the box office computer as cash sales when they were actually given out as complementary tickets not subject to the ticket fee. This mistake was discovered during an audit of box office receipts. I have entered a credit of \$2.00 on the current report to bring the accounting of sales in line with actual activity.

As always, the College is extremely grateful for the invaluable assistance provided to us by the City. Without your financial assistance, our students would not have access to this incredible facility.
