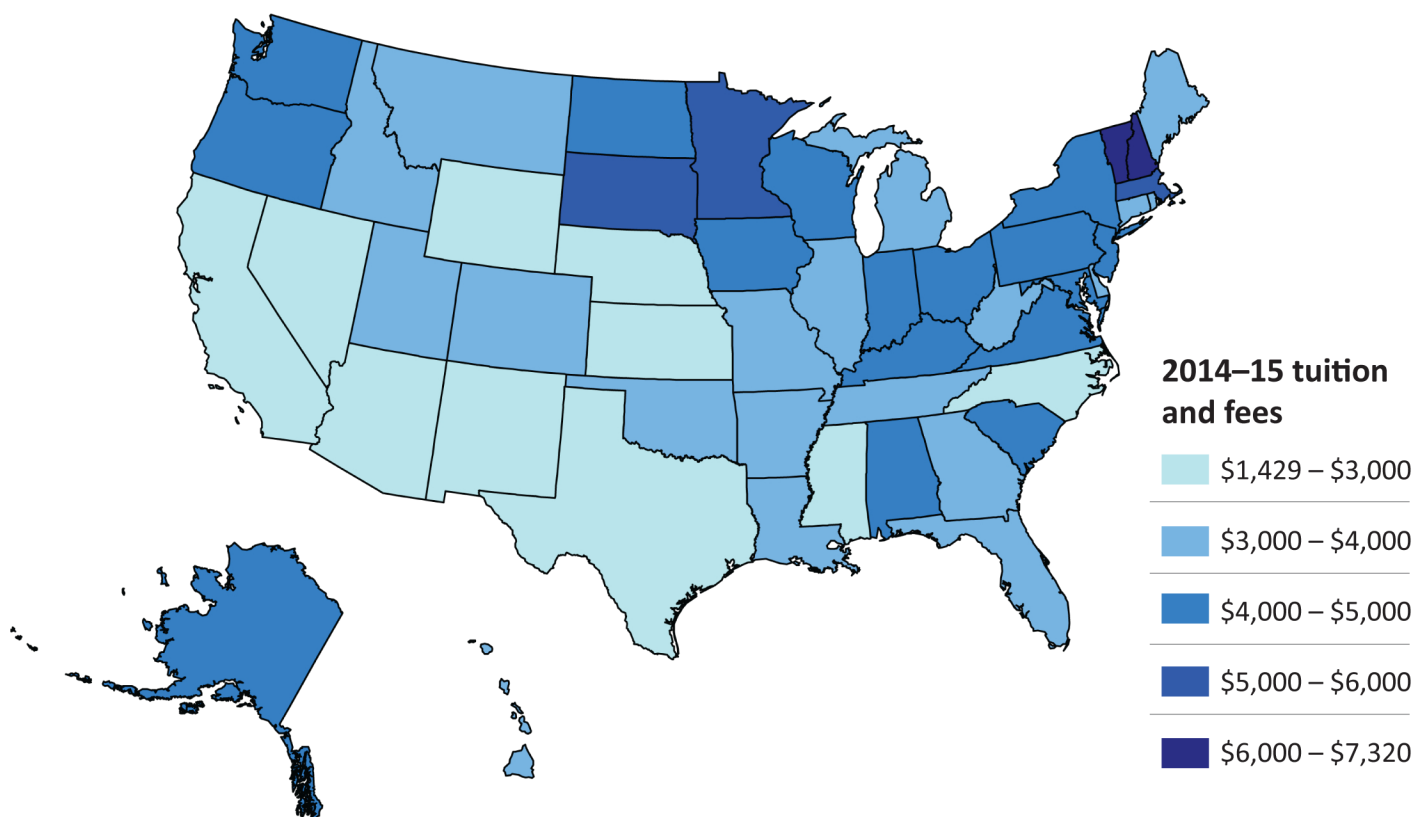


Tuition and fees

The average community college tuition and fees are \$3,347, compared to \$9,139 at four-year institutions.

For the 2014-15 academic year, the average tuition and fees for public, two-year, in-district institutions for full-time students are about \$3,347. Fourteen states offered college prices that were less than the national average tuition and fees. California, which represents about 12 percent of all U.S. community colleges, had the lowest college price at \$1,429; Vermont had the highest with tuition and fees at \$7,320. For the same academic year, the average tuition and fees for public, four-year, in-district institutions nationally was \$9,139. The lowest price was \$4,646 in California; the highest was \$14,712 in New Hampshire.
