Lori Walker has been a full-time professor at Mt. SAC for the past 16 years teaching Writing, Math, and STDY Student Success courses in Learning Assistance. She has her M.A. and Ph.D. from Claremont Graduate University where her dissertation focused on using brain-based learning developments to create successful, student-centered learning communities in higher education. Previously, Lori served as a professor, Assistant Dean, and Associate Dean at Cal State Fullerton. Her love of teaching brought her to Mt. SAC where she can be in the classroom full-time. Lori also teaches Kundalini yoga, a practice which has found substantial support in the scientific literature for expanding the brain's capacity for learning and development.
