9. Summary of Program Activities: Healthcare occupations lead the list at every level of educational training for high growth positions in the region especially in job vacancies requiring "high school graduation, industry recognized certifications and Associate degrees. This model provides more training opportunities by offering a dual enrollment model where students can take multiple training modules at both institutions at the same time or in sequence, thus diffusing the enrollment impact and accelerating the completion of middle to high skill stackable certifications.

By pooling and leveraging the resources of its partners throughout this larger regional economic area participants receive multiple tuition-free training option, paid internships, and ongoing support services to provide Career pathways in a series of rigorous industry recognized certification programs currently held by H-lB visa employees. SGVHEH creates a diversity of training options through a unique model used by the

primary post-secondary education partners, which allows students to move back and forth between the two institutions in a dual post- secondary enrollment model that

- o accelerates the training,
- o provides multiple career pathway options,
- leverages existing resources at these public post-secondary schools, including an existing direct funded DOL Youth Career Connect Grant (grant #YC-25405-14-60-A-6, CFDA #17.274).
