Project Updates April 13, 2017

Recent CCC Maker project activities included:

- Regional workshops were held in Sacramento, Inland Empire, San Diego and the Bay Area in March. Similar meet-ups were scheduled in April in Los Angeles and Orange County.
- 20 people from seven colleges attended the two-day CCC Maker: New World of Work 21st Century Skills Training in Pasadena on March 16-17.

21st Century Skills Training Held in March

In addition to the New World of Work training to prepare students for internships and employment, CCC Maker added sessions on digital badges and design thinking. Participants from Sierra College, Pasadena City College (PCC), Folsom Lake College, Glendale Community College, Moorpark College, Saddleback College, Palomar College and Alan Hancock College also toured the PCC Fab Lab.

Regional Meet-ups

The initiative held six regional meetings to encourage an exchange ideas and increase collaboration across districts. To build the CCC Maker Community of Practice across the state, CCC Maker is establishing traditions such as making a small project during the session, touring a local makerspace and offering a gift made by students.

Inland Empire Meeting

CCC Maker representatives from **Mt San Jacinto, Moreno Valley** and **San Bernardino Community Colleges** attended this meeting, hosted at the San Bernardino Community College District Offices. Through a Design Thinking process, participants identified unique opportunities, such as availability of dedicated space and existing mobile labs, as well as considered challenges, including a high percentage of part-time students. San Diego Meeting

San Diego Community College District hosted and participated in this meet-up that was also attended by representatives from Alan Hancock Community, Palomar Community College and Mira Costa College. They also toured FAB LAB San Diego. The Palomar team approached the planning from the student entrepreneurship and internship component, working backward into the makerspace requirements. Mind Maps Used at CCSF

City College of San Francisco used visual mind maps as a technique to collect ideas and build community among the makerspace planning team. Taking the results from previous research, a mind map was made for each discipline, explained Veronica Sanchez Casian. "We passed out the mind maps and asked faculty to add in anything that was missing to the existing maps," said Sanchez Casian. "First, they added current connections and then what might be planned. After that, they brainstormed what would be desirable and other possibilities."

Deborah Bird, TAP, CCC Maker, indicated that mind mapping can be very engaging. "It is a really powerful process to have everyone brainstorm and make the ideas visual through diagramming," said Bird. "It can help clarify concepts and show holistic thinking about the issue, as well as make sure that everyone understands the needs of other groups."

The mind maps also proved useful in adding connections to the college ecosystem map, according to Sanchez Casian. "The process helped us all get on the same page once everyone shared what they had added and it helped to build a sense of team/community in the project," said Sanchez Casian. "The experience really moved our planning process forward."
