Response to Academic Senate Resolution 2017-02, Regarding Dual Enrollment

The College accepts the Resolved statements in the above named Resolution with the following proposal. Acceptance of this proposal requires mutual agreement with the Academic Senate.

- 1. Dual Enrollment is accepted as an "other academic and professional matter" under Title 5 §53200(c)(11).
- 2. Collegial consultation on Dual Enrollment is by mutual agreement as specified in Title 5 §53200(d)(2).
- 3. The Dual Enrollment Mutual Agreement Committee (DEMAC) is the primary body for reaching mutual agreement between the academic senate and administration on academic issues pertinent to dual enrollment and making recommendations regarding the implementation of dual enrollment.
- 4. DEMAC is a governance committee which reports to President's Advisory Council.
- 5. The function of DEMAC is to
 - 1) Review and approve proposed dual enrollment agreements with K-12 partners.
 - 2) Recommend proposed and ongoing College policies regarding dual enrollment programs.
 - 3) Make recommendations for maintaining and improving the quality of students' educational achievement in the College's dual enrollment classes.
 - 4) Monitor the implementation of dual enrollment agreements with K-12 partners.
 - 5) Review data on the College's dual enrollment agreements with K-12 partners and make recommendations as needed.
- 6. DEMAC will have the following ten (10) members:
 - 1) Associate Vice President, Instruction (Co-Chair)
 - 2) Vice President, Academic Senate (Co-Chair)
 - 3) Student Services Manager, appointed by the Vice President, Student Services
 - 4) 2 Deans or Associate Deans, appointed by the Vice President, Instruction
 - 5) Associate Dean, Counseling
 - 6) 3 Faculty, At-large, appointed by the Academic Senate
 - 7) 1 Faculty, At-large, appointed by the Faculty Association
- 7. Upon mutual agreement of the Academic Senate and administration, BP 3255, Participation in Local Decision-Making, will be appropriately amended to propose to the Board of Trustees that dual enrollment be added as an "other academic and professional matter," and AP 3255 will be appropriately amended to include the definition of the Dual Enrollment Mutual Agreement Committee with the specifications enumerated in items #1 through #5 above.
