Re: Dual Enrollment Update to Mt. SAC Board of Trustees

Mt. SAC's Dual Enrollment Program was created in the wake of 2016 state measure called *College* and *Career Access Pathways* (CCAP), which established the ability to create partnerships between community college and high school districts to bolster the number of college-ready students. In addition to offering Mt. SAC classes in the high school setting, Mt. SAC is waiving the tuition and textbook fees for high school students.

Mt. SAC has signed Memorandums of Understanding with five High School Districts allowing us to offer college courses at 12 high schools: Gladstone, IPOLY, Ganesha, Diamond Ranch, Garey, Pomona, Fremont Academy, Village Academy, Rowland, Nogales, Edgewood, and West Covina.

The college is currently collaborating with other schools to expand the Dual Enrollment Program and is developing the Mt. SAC Early College Academy at West Covina.
