Which Colleges Should Attend?

Colleges who have been intentionally engaged in GP transformation efforts for at least two years (see key elements 1–3 of the CCCCCO GP [self-assessment](#)) and meet at least two of the following criteria:

- Studied your student data (see key elements 1–3 of the [self-assessment](#));
- Begun to design or map meta-majors OR has organized integrated planning efforts and activities around GP design principles (see key elements 4–8 of the [self-assessment](#));
- Developed and implemented practices, communications, or systems to assist with GP inquiry or design and would be interested in sharing.
