






### LATINX IN CALIFORNIA HIGHER EDUCATION **LEADERSHIP**

ith more than 1.2 million Latinx enrolled in California's public colleges and universities in 2016-17, Latinx students are the largest ethnic group in California colleges and universities (43%) followed by White (26%) and AANHPI (16%) students. Between 1996 and 2016, the number of Latinx students enrolled in college increased from 571,000 to 1.2 million, representing a 120% increase over the last two decades. Though the vast majority of Latinx students attend the state's community colleges, enrollment increases are evident across all of higher education such that their share of the student population doubled over that time.

Latinx students make up the largest share of enrollments in California's community colleges and the CSUs and more than a quarter at the UC in the 2016-17 academic year. However, they are significantly underrepresented amongst college faculty across the UC, CSU and community colleges. Less than 1 in 10 leaders are Latinx at the UC and the CSU. While Latinx representation in California's community colleges is marginally better, only 1.5 in 10 leaders are Latinx.
