## New Funding Formula Mt. SAC Analysis, Data, and Impact Mike Gregoryk

- o Mt. SAC has the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest non-credit FTES population of all CCD's (San Diego CCD #1, Mt. SAC #2, Los Angeles CCD #3, San Francisco CCD #4). This is one of the factors contributing to Mt. SAC having the lowest funding per FTES of all CCD's (\$5,157.55 which is \$145.44 or 2.7% lower than the next lowest CCD).
- Using the DOF Formula Simulation spreadsheet, revised calculations using the new Weighting Factors and 3-year FTES averages are:
  - 70%-20%-10% yields \$10.2 M for 2018-19
  - 65%-20%-15% yields \$7.6 M for 2019-20
  - 60%-20%-20% yields \$5.0 M for 2020-21
  - With the 3 year phase-in period for the Weighting Factors, Mt. SAC is projected to have the largest percentage drop (-50.9%) and dollar amount drop (-\$5.2 M) of all CC's. The next largest percentage reduction is Southwestern at 35.2% and dollar amount reduction is San Diego at \$3.7 M. Rancho Santiago has the largest percentage increase (+84.7%) and dollar amount increase (+\$6.0 M).

## All CCD's

- 49% of all California community colleges in 'decline' during 2017-18 are projected to receive increased funding, and 57% of all CCD's in 'growth' during 2017-18 are projected to receive no new funding.
- Will Advance Budget Allocations be estimated using 3- and 5-year averages from at least 2 years prior for equity and success portions of the calculation? Currently, funding is based on FTES at P1, P2, and year-end.
- 'Summer Shift' will not change. Since the colleges are being held harmless for the next three years, CC's can carry over the majority of 2020-21 summer into 2021-22 and beyond.
- No calculations will be performed until Governor's approval and Trailer Bill is released.
- Advance Budget should be sent by the end of July.
- Budget Workshops (8/15 for Southern California, 8/13 for Northern California)

- o Why has there been minimal transparency throughout the process?
- o For the next 3 years, the Community Colleges will be held harmless to 2017-18 Funding amounts (plus COLA), but what happens on the 4th year? How to handle negotiations with bargaining units and ongoing funds?
