- 3) What OCC is not: no competition with 114 others, not privatizing CCCs, will be able to reach target population, no competition with OEI, not a silver bullet

Academic Senate (<u>link</u>)

- 1) Drains money from other 114,
- 2) OEI is a better choice,
- 3) OCC is a risky venture,
- 4) OCC students will be isolated from other 114, and
- 5) unlikely to be accredited

Bill Scroggins (link)

- 1) Positives: statewide, flexible and innovative design (competency-based, credit for prior learning, open-entry-open exist, work-based learning, business-driven competencies), built for modern workers (not place- or salary-bound)
- 2) A unique pilot rather like a "charter community college"
- 3) Many Challenges Remain: governance, financial aid, accreditation, and financing, but gives the legislature the opportunity address these

- 4) Not a treat to other 114 <u>if</u> design as a fully online CTE competency based college delivering badges and certificates
- 5) Trailer bill language goes beyond this model (associate degrees, transfer) and thus is a threat to other 114—and does not address challenges
