



Guiding Principles for Academic Support






Principles and standards should be applied that are important at the college.

Responsiveness to student need


Faculty mediation





 - Recording outcomes Tracdat training






- Identified existing PIEs

Where does it all take place?


- 16 different centers/locations with titles, names, "brands"

Actual Expenditures – Hourly Academic Support



- 17-18 totaled \$2.65M
- 18-19 totals \$1.29M (through Dec 18)
- 18-19 budgeted expenses EST \$3M+

Budget Considerations



- Continue tracking hourly expenditures and college commitment to academic support
- Avoid encumbering duplicate allocations from different funding sources
- Eliminate excessive hiring and payroll paperwork
- Align and more intentionally plan, budget, and deliver academic support
