

## Mt SAC Legislative Report 2018 Report as of 12/13/2018

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AB 2 (Santiago D) Community colleges: California College Promise.

Current Text: Introduced: 12/3/2018 <a href="https://html.pdf">html</a> <a href="pdf">pdf</a>

**Status:** 12/4/2018-From printer. May be heard in committee January 3.

Location: 12/3/2018-A. PRINT

**Summary:** Current law establishes the California College Promise, under the administration of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, to provide funding, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to each community college meeting prescribed requirements. Current law authorizes a community college to use that funding to waive some or all of the fees for one academic year for certain first-time students who are enrolled in 12 or more semester units or the equivalent at the college and complete and submit either a Free Application for Federal Student Aid or a California Dream Act application. This bill would instead authorize a community college to use California College Promise funding to waive fees for 2 academic years for these students.

**Summary:** Would enact the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of 2020 which, upon approval by the state electorate, would authorize the issuance of state general obligation bonds in the total amount of \$7,000,000,000. The proceeds of the bonds issued and sold under the bill would be available for the construction, reconstruction, and remodeling of existing or new facilities, as specified, at the University of California, the Hastings College of the Law, and the California State University in specified proportions, including \$3,000,000,000 for the construction of new campuses of the California State University.

**Summary:** Would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to incentivize systems that better facilitate communication and partnerships between businesses, labor advocates, and educational institutions for the purpose of creating tailored workforce training programs that both increase worker participation and further the attainment of increased skills. The bill would make related legislative findings and declarations.

AB 30 (Holden D) Community colleges: College and Career Access Pathways partnerships.

**Summary:** Would delete the requirement on the governing board of each district entering into a CCAP partnership agreement to present the dual enrollment partnership agreement as an informational item at a separate open public meeting of that board before taking public comment and acting to approve or disapprove the proposed agreement. The bill would provide that units completed by a pupil pursuant to a CCAP agreement may count towards determining a pupil's registration priority for enrollment and course registration at a community college. The bill would require the CCAP partnership agreement to include a plan, instead of a certification, by the participating community college district to ensure specified conditions are met.

AB 48 (O'Donnell D) Kindergarten-Community Colleges Public Education Facilities Bond Acts of 2020 and 2022.

**Summary:** Would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would create the Kindergarten-Community Colleges Public Education Facilities Bond Acts of 2020 and 2022, state general obligation bond acts that would provide funds to construct and modernize education facilities, to become operative only if approved by the voters at unspecified 2020 and 2022 elections, and to provide for the submission of the bond acts to the voters at those elections.

**Summary:** Current law requires the Secretary of State to annually provide every high school, community college, and California State University and University of California campus with voter registration forms. Current law also expresses the intent of the Legislature that every eligible high school and college students receive a meaningful opportunity to register to vote. This bill would express the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would make a polling place or vote center available on every college and university campus in the state.

**Summary:** Would express the intent of the Legislature to establish the Statewide Longitudinal Student Database to collect and store data regarding individual students as they matriculate through P–20, as defined, and into the workforce. The bill would require the California Postsecondary Education Commission to convene a review committee for purposes of advising the commission on the establishment, implementation, funding, and ongoing administration of the database.

**SB 3** (Allen D) Office of Higher Education Coordination, Accountability, and Performance.

**Status:** 12/4/2018-From printer. May be acted upon on or after January 3.

Location: 12/3/2018-S. RLS.

**Summary:** Would establish the Office of Higher Education Coordination, Accountability, and Performance. The bill would give the office specified functions and responsibilities for purposes of statewide postsecondary education planning, oversight, data collection, and coordination. The bill would require the public postsecondary segments and the Labor and Workforce Development Agency to submit specified data to the office so it may carry out its functions and responsibilities. The bill would apply to the University of California only to the extent the Regents act by resolution to make it apply.

**SB 14** (**Glazer** D) Education finance: Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of 2020.

**Summary:** Would enact the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of 2020, which, upon approval by the state electorate, would authorize the issuance of state general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000,000, with one-half of the amount designated for the University of California and the Hastings College of the Law and the other half designated for the California State University, for purposes similar to those specified in the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of 1986, the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of 1988, and the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act of June 1992, to be issued and sold in a manner similar to that provided under those acts.

SB 24 (Leyva D) Public health: public university student health centers: abortion by medication techniques.

**Summary:** Current law establishes the University of California, under the administration of the Regents of the University of California, and the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University, as 2 of the segments of public postsecondary education in this state. This bill would express findings and declarations of the Legislature relating to the availability of abortion by medication techniques at on-campus student health centers at public postsecondary educational institutions in the state.
