Below is a comparison of the Chancellor's Office view with the Mt. SAC view of programs and metrics.

Combining Adult Ed with ESL fails to recognize the different outcomes targeted for each group. While the CO group characteristics include “literacy,” there is not metric for this desired outcome. Note that literacy is the main outcome highlighted by Mt. SAC. For a complete list of Mt. SAC ESL outcomes follow this link . These linked SLOs include preparation for U.S. Citizenship and access to services (DMV, dentist, DSS, etc.) The CO metrics do not include high school diploma or equivalency. One of the authorized noncredit areas of instruction is Older Adults which regulations transitioned from avocational to encore career training.

Featuring both certificate programs that mirror credit programs in the College and fee-based certificate programs, students have the opportunity to enroll in a broad variety of programs that interest them.
			16%	14%	Credit Low Unit Skill Certs	"Skills Certificates" are lower-unit certificates in various occupational areas. Although the awarding of Skills Certificates is not noted on a student's official transcript, the student may apply for and receive a documentation certificate from the college that may be of value in documenting knowledge and skills to potential employers. In many cases, entry-level Skills Certificates may be part of a ladder-track of increasing levels of preparation in an occupational area, and courses used to complete them may form a core of requirements that are augmented as students pursue higher levels of proficiency toward a Certificate of Achievement.
It appears that CO's Short-Term CTE Student definition mixes credit and noncredit—very different students and programs—mixed metrics are not useful for decision making. I also appears that “short term” outcomes also includes two year degrees and certificates—again not useful for accountability decision making.
