CARES ACT REPORTING

- On April 15, 2020, Mt. San Antonio College signed and returned to the Department
 of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution
 has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under
 Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to
 students. Confirmation that the Agreement was received by the Department of
 Education was received on April 15, 2020.
- 2. The allocation of CARES Act funds received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students was \$8,728,980.
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students meeting the eligibility criteria under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of May 8, 2020 is \$6,989,800 that was disbursed to 10,401 currently students with the highest need. Grants ranged from \$400 to \$900 per student, based on their enrollment at Census ("FA Frozen Units") and calculated unmet need. Students who received funds were certified and documented as meeting the Title IV eligibility criteria at the time of determination. The additional funds will continue to be disseminated during the balance of the college's Spring 2020 term.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of May 1, 2020 is 11,803.
- 5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, as of May 8, 2020 is 10,401.
- 6. Mt. San Antonio College awarded Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students who were eligible to receive the Pell grant under Title IV as well as students who filed the FAFSA, regardless of their receipt of the Pell grant under Title IV. The amount of the awards was based on the calculated unmet need for each enrolled student using the graduated analysis process and based on the number of units at Census ("FA Frozen Units").

7. Upon notification of the pending awarding of funds, students receiving the Emergency Financial Aid grants were provided with this email communication, documenting the purposes for which the student was eligible to receive and expend the funds on food, housing, course materials, healthcare and/or technology.
