As such, there is growing concern about the extent to which traditional structures for awarding college credit are impacting the ability of nontraditional students to attain the skills and credentials needed to advance their careers on an accelerated basis. This forum will explore the nuances of credit and non-credit programming and the implications of the for-credit / non-credit divide on some of the most vulnerable populations served by community colleges. The forum will also present on promising practices that community colleges and states are implementing to award credit for non-credit coursework and the positive outcomes that can come from this successful bridging.
