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SEVP POLICY GUIDELINES FOR COVID-19

- Electronic signatures will be accepted for travel, OPT, and initial I-20s. These documents can be sent out electronically to students.
- Actively enrolled F-1 students will be permitted to take multiple online courses to maintain status.
- Actively enrolled F-1 students will be permitted to return to their home country during the Spring/Summer/ Fall semester and remain in active status while taking online college courses.
- Students on Authorized Early Withdrawal will not be reactivated in SEVIS unless they have travel plans to return to the U.S.
- Initial status students will not be able to begin the Fall semester of classes online as an F-1 students unless they have successfully entered the U.S.
- F-1 high school transfer students will not be able to begin their Fall semester online if they remain in their country and have not entered the U.S.




Mt. SAC F-1 (COVID-19) UPDATE

- I-17 SEVP Campus Amendments submitted to USCIS for Spring. ISP will need to submit an additional I-17 update for Fall to USCIS. Due date July 1, 2020.
- Currently, we have 42 actively enrolled F-1 students that have returned to their home country and are taking Mt. SAC online class this spring semester.
- Per guidance from SEVP in March of 2020 we placed 33 F-1 students on an Authorized Early Withdrawal with the understanding that we could reactivate their I-20 upon return to Mt. SAC. New guidance released May 2020 stipulates that we will not be able to reactivate their I-20 unless they plan to return to the U.S. At this point, none of the 33 students are planning to return.
- ISP communication with students has included a health and wellness survey, phone calls to students, a series of five town hall events including a tele-health event, weekly email updates, daily social media posts to WeChat/Instagram/Twitter/Facebook, and website updates to provide accurate information to our F-1 students. Additionally, we have created virtual communities and maintained doing all of our planned student programming i.e. Global Pals, Explorer Series, Global Café, Workshops, online orientation, and end of year events.






Mt. SAC F-1 ENROLLMENT

International Student Health insurance

BACKGROUND

 International F-1 visa students are required to carry U.S.-based health insurance as a condition of their enrollment at Mt. San Antonio College. In June 2019, the Board of Trustees approved a 12-month agreement with Student Insurance to provide a health insurance program for international students with coverage from August 1, 2019, through July 31, 2020, at an annual rate of \$1,015 per student.

ANALYSIS AND FISCAL IMPACT

- Student Insurance has proposed to renew the same health insurance policy that was approved in June 2019 for the period of August 1, 2020, through July 31, 2021, at an increased annual cost of \$1,272. The \$257 increased annual cost is attributed to a 57% loss rate experienced during the term of the current agreement. The proposed health insurance policy from Student Insurance will continue to provide the best possible medical/illness coverage at the most competitive rate to our international students.
- The decision was made to continue the contract with Student Insurance for another year, based on the proposed rates and the strength of the plan. It is recommended that the College renew its agreement with Student Insurance with an annual rate of \$1,272 per student or \$636 per semester, with a maximum benefit of \$250,000.
