experience housing instability each year. In recognition of this reality, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors authorized funding via Measure H to support the implementation of a Peer Navigator Program beginning in FY2019-20.

The Campus Peer Navigator Program

aims to connect community college students who are experiencing homelessness or at-risk of homelessness with resources that can end their housing crisis. The objectives of the program include:

- Connecting students to community resources and the Coordinated Entry System (CES)
- Improving linkages between colleges and homeless services providers across Los Angeles County
- Streamlining the CES referral process
- Enhancing communication and partnerships

Co-location across 21 campuses

campus peer navigators are available to serve students by meeting them where they are at, reducing barriers to access, and helping navigate the system.
