



What is it?

- Serving students who are close to completing a certificate, degree, and/or transfer
- Have a centralized location for students who are close to completion that are seeking specific support and assistance
- Targeted counseling services for close to completion students



Why do this?

- Students often do not know how close they are to completing
- Ensure that students getting closer to completing receive targeted support and milestone type services
- Guided Pathways (GPS) Framework Completion Pathway
- Outcomes Based Funding



Who are we targeting?

- Students who have completed 45 or more units
- Have a 2.0 GPA or higher
- Completed Math or English or both
- Student-centered funding formula: focus on outcomes for low income and under-served students
 - Caseload based follow up for financial aid applicants



Where are we located?

- Completion Center will be located in 9G (for now)
- Box Tree Facility the Completion Center will later move to the new location between 9B and Mountie Café
 - The facility will have 12 offices, computers for student usage, space for SSPS II – Completion Staff, and a multipurpose room



Institutional Commitment & Resources


- Resources hiring staff and re-directing faculty counselors
