## **FALL 2019 ENROLLMENT**

- 1 section of READ 70: Approaches to Reading (24 students)
- 12 sections of READ 90: Reading College Texts (288 students distance learning and face-to-face)
- 4 sections of READ 100: Analysis and Critical Reading (107 students distance learning and face-to-face)

**Total READ students: 419** 

## **ASSESSMENT**

#### AQ 1 & AQ 2 as of Fall 2019:

18,323 students eligible for READ 100: Analysis and Critical Reading (eligibility for READ 100 meets graduation reading competency

6,872 students eligible for READ 90: Reading College Texts

#### READING COMPETENCY

The Multiple Measures Task Force recommendation to continue to use eligibility for READ 100: Analysis and Critical Reading to meet the graduation-reading competency will be a discussion item on the September 5, 2019 Senate agenda and an action item on September 19th.

# STUDENT SUPPORT

#### Summer 2019 Step READ Workshops:

Approximately 476 students attended summer STEP college-reading workshops to learn about academic resources and coursework designed to support comprehension of discipline specific texts.

After the STEP college-reading workshops, approximately 50% of participants said they were interested in taking a READ course.

A follow up survey will be given in Fall 2019 READ classes to see how many students enrolled based on information given in STEP workshops.

**Guided Pathways Funded Contextualized Reading Pilot:** 

- Faculty members from Biology, Welding, Horticulture, Astronomy, Public Safety,
  Political Science, and Radiology Technician have worked in collaboration with Melissa
  Berkley from Production/Broadcasting to create short "textbook walk-through" videos
  to scaffold students into discipline specific texts.
- In June 2019, READ faculty submitted an "Academic Literacy for Equity" faculty
  professional development module for review by the Faculty Professional Development
  Committee (FPDC). Modifications have been made and the contextualized reading
  training, pending approval, will be offered this fall.
