English AB 705 Coordinator

4 LHE for fall semester

- Support implementation of AB 705 for English and act as a faculty resource on AB 705 for the college

- · Work with SSSPAC and other appropriate committees to make recommendations regarding revisions and refinements Assessment Questionnaire (AQ)
- Work with RIE to research effects of AB 705, including the achievement of students who would have placed in below-transfer courses prior to AB 705
- Collaborate with Counseling to ensure English placement information is shared
- Utilize research findings to inform further development of strategies to support student completion of transfer-level English

- Develop communication and messaging for students regarding assessment in collaboration with Counseling
- Work on Assessment Instrument for students who do not have a high school GPA

Math AB 705 Coordinator

5 LHE for fall semester

- Support implementation of AB 705 for Math and act as a faculty resource on AB 705 for the college
- · Research and collaborate with faculty on the development and implementation of curriculum and strategies to support student completion of transfer-level math courses
- Work with SSSPAC and/or other appropriate committees to make recommendations regarding the Assessment Questionnaire
- Work on revisions and refinements to the AQ
- Work with RIE to research effects of AB 705, including the achievement of students who would have placed in below-transfer courses prior to AB 705
- Utilize research findings to inform further development of strategies to support student completion of transfer-level math.
- Coordinate and support Math faculty who are working with students on math placement to 140, 160, or 180- including scheduling, training, and creating and updating materials used to assist with math placement
- · Collaborate with Counseling to ensure Math placement information is shared with Counselors
- Work with noncredit faculty to support a pathway from noncredit to credit math coursework
- Meet with the Academic Senate President and report to Academic Senate

AMLA AB 705 Coordinator

4 LHE for fall semester

Support implementation of AB 705 for AMLA

- Research, stay abreast of, and lead implementation of AB 705 guidelines for AMLA
- Represent AMLA on appropriate committees under integration of Student Equity, BSI, SSSPAC
- Coordinate AWE and additional AWE readers (if needed)
- Design and implement new assessment and placement for non-native English speakers in accordance with AB705 and state guidelines
- Collaborate and communicate with faculty, staff, and managers from Counseling, Assessment, Academic Senate, Academic Support Centers, Information Technology (IT), Research and Institutional Effectiveness (RIE), School of Continuing Education, the Outcomes Committee, marketing, and faculty from other departments on AMLA placement
- · Work with noncredit faculty to support a pathway from noncredit to credit ESL coursework
- Attend statewide conferences; collaborate with faculty at other California community colleges regarding AB 705 compliance and to share best practices; participate in state-level organizations as needed to support role.
