

Strong Workforce Program Funding Formula

Both the Strong Workforce Program base and incentive funding are re-calculated each year according to the factors prescribed in legislation:

Factors		Proportion of SWP Funds

Incentive Funding	SWP Metrics	1/6





Strong Workforce Program Base Funding



Unemployment Rate

Adjustments to the SWP base funding allocation include:

- For the Regional Share: Indexing the regional unemployment rate as compared to the statewide rate of 4.2%.
- For Local Share: Use the Regional unemployment rate index and then estimate the unemployed population at the district level, as district-level unemployment rates are not reliable in all areas of the state.

Because job openings data is unavailable at the district level, local share allocations use residential population for district service areas to determine the proportion of job openings.


